I <u>admire</u> her: I have <u>a feeling of deep respect</u> and approval for her.

Different sentence structures:

I know it might take time to get there, but it's worth it.

It's an idiomatic expression of saying that the result of something is greater than the effort to get it.

Worth + noun phrase (Value):

Subject + be verb + worth + noun phrase

It means something has a certain value, either monetary or otherwise.

The old painting is worth a lot of money.

Worth + -ing verb (Importance/Effort)

It's worth + verb ending in -ing

It's worth checking the weather before you leave.

Worth + possessive pronoun + while (General Importance)

Subject + be verb + worthwhile

Thank you for your suggestion. It was worthwhile.

Key points:

Worth is a predicate adjective. You must use a <u>to be verb</u> before it.

This car is worth \$20,000.

Worth is followed by a verb, the verb must be in —ing form, not the infinitive.

It's worth reading this book.
