

Different sentence structures:

I've packed all my essentials and my suitcase is ready to go.



- To talk about something that <u>has happened in the</u>
 <u>past</u> but the <u>consequences</u> are visible in <u>the present</u>,
 is called the <u>present perfect tense</u>.
- When the action <u>started in the past</u> but <u>continued to</u>
 <u>the present</u>, present perfect tense is the best to use.
 In this case, using "for" to show the time reference is important.
- Whenever you want to <u>talk about your experiences</u>, use the present perfect tense.

Examples in the sequence of the explanations:

I have lost my keys.

I lost them in the past and the result is that I don't have them now.

We have lived here for ten years.

The action started in the past and is still continuing in the present.

I have visited many countries.

I am talking about my experience of travelling to many countries, without mentioning the exact time.

This structure forms with a <u>subject</u>, followed by either "<u>have</u>" or "<u>has</u>" depending on the subject, then <u>the past participle</u> <u>form of the verb.</u>

More examples:

She has done her project.

My friends have gone to the North.

You have met that famous actor!
